



## **MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING**

**BETWEEN**  
**ARAB FEDRATION OF CHAMBERS OF SHIPPING**  
**AND**  
**ASSOCIATION OF AFRICAN MARITIME ADMINISTRATION**  
**“SHARM ELSHEIKH – EGYPT“ 16 September 2018**

This Memorandum of Understanding (hereinafter the MOU) is concluded between THE ARAB FEDRATION OF CHAMBERS OF SHIPPING (Hereinafter AFCS) and The ASSOCTION OF AFRICAN MARITIME ADMINISTRATION (hereinafter AAMA).

### **ARTICLE 1 – GENERAL**

1. By the virtue of the brotherly ties between the (AFCS) and the (AAMA) show the intention of achieving the following objectives:
  - 1.1. Attend such (AFCS) & (AAMA) meetings as an observer.
  - 1.2. To cooperate in the field of training and interchanging information related to the operation and management of both parties.
  - 1.3. To establish better bases of cooperation in the maritime transport operations between both parties.
  - 1.4. To contribute to the development of the commercial and economic relationship for the mutual benefit of the two parties.
  - 1.5. Among the topics proposed for presentation and discussion, the Procedures and specifications required to make Arab and African Ports, (Green Ports).

**ARTICLE 2- Taking into consideration the above mentioned Objectives and for purpose of their achievement both parties agree:**

- 2.1. To exert efforts in order to facilitate any obstacle facing the other party.
- 2.2. To exchange experience and visits between the two parties and to coordinate between them the adaptation of a unified stand towards the resolution issued by international conferences on maritime transport.
- 2.3. To promote the technical cooperation between the two parties through the training of technical and administrative personnel in the appropriate training institutes or organizations.
- 2.4. To negotiate between (AAMA) and the (AFCS) on recognition of training plans and its certifications.

**ARTICLE 3 - MISCELLANEOUS**

- 3.1. Notwithstanding any Provisions to the Contrary in this MOU, this MOU constitutes an expression of Mutual good Faith and is not intended to create legally binding obligations on either party. This MOU does not commit either of the Parties to enter into or provide Support for any Specific activity or project /Programme .This MOU does not represent any commitment on the party of either party to give preferred treatment to the other in any matter contemplated under this MOU.
- 3.2 In keeping with the administrative nature of these arrangements, no provision of this MOU will be construed to interfere in any way with the independent decision-making autonomy of the two parties with regard to their respective affairs and operations.
- 3.3 This M.O.U shall enter into force on the date of its signature by both Parties.
- 3.4 Either party may terminate this M.O.U at any time by giving the other party written of three months.
